

St. Augustine Preparatory Academy Case Study



St. Augustine Preparatory Academy (Aug Prep) is a private school on the South Side of Milwaukee, one of the most segregated cities in the United States.

Since opening in 2017 with 600 students, Aug Prep has tripled its enrollment. High School Principal Jack Wallace credits this growth to the school's focus on college prep and improvements in student test scores, attendance, and graduation rate.

Despite their success in high school, Aug Prep's first graduating class struggled in college. "We didn't do enough to prepare them academically," Wallace said. This prompted Wallace's search for programs that would increase the rigor of academics at Aug Prep.



Implementation

Aug Prep offered seniors the opportunity to take Outlier's College Writing and Intro to Psychology. These courses complemented the school's existing AP® courses, giving students more options. Before classes began, Principal Wallace and the teachers took time to set expectations and prepare students for the pace and workload of these college-level courses.

With the students' success, Wallace continues to see increased enrollment. And with Outlier among its suite of college prep programs, Aug Prep has the capacity to support that growth.


